

Wine Tasting Guide

White and Rosé wines have a scale of 1–9, with 1 being very dry through to 9, having a dessert wine level of sweetness. Examples of wines which are typically graded 1 are Sauvignon Blanc, Italian and Spanish whites; 2 and 3 tend to be softer styles such as Chardonnay and Viognier; and the sweeter wines are the blush Rosés, like White Zinfandel – graded at a 5 or 6.

Red wines are marked on a scale of A–E. Lighter reds, like Beaujolais, Valpolicella or Côtes du Rhône will be graded A or B, while more chunky wines like Shiraz, Bordeaux and Rioja are a D or E.

To make your selection even easier, we have a simple style guide to each of our still wines. So whether you want a light white to go with fish, or a big gutsy red to enjoy with a steak, these style icons will help.



03. UK On Trade Trends

SUSTAINABLE, ORGANIC & BIODYNAMIC

Organic sales have experienced years of consecutive growth in the UK, with beers, wines and spirits being among the fastest growing categories - embracing these practices can help you drive appeal.

Green and ethical labelling is however still quite confusing for consumers and producers alike. There are so many certification systems, some of which come with a high level of cost or bureaucracy, and each certification sets its own standards, some more stringent than others. For many producers, particularly smaller businesses, choosing to set their own benchmarks and environmental commitments can achieve the same or better results, though they can't make claims on labels, (terms like 'organic' are rightly controlled by legislation, protecting consumers from being misled.)

We have chosen to give you all the information so you can make your choices accordingly. If you wish to select a range which comes with official organic, biodynamic or sustainable certification so you can label it on your menus, look out for wines labelled 'C', for certified. If your aim is to support the underlying principles even if the wines can't state an official claim, look out for wines with 'P', for practicing – this means our producers have told us about environmental standards they set for themselves, but they don't subscribe to any official certification program as yet. Let us know if you'd like to know more about specific wines in the range.

ORGANIC

Organic farming involves the strict control of pesticides, fungicides, herbicides and fertilizers, and in some countries there are controls over the use of winery chemicals. The goal is to promote healthy biologically active soil, preserve natural soil structures and promote biodiversity.

BIODYNAMIC

This approach has a lot in common with organic farming, with a more philosophical ethos. Biodynamic growers consider the whole vineyard to be a holistic organism in tune with natural rhythms on an astrological scale.

SUSTAINABLE

This refers to the long-term impact of our activity on the planet, whether through the environmental impact of farming, renewable energy sources or general energy consumption, water and heat recycling, emissions, social responsibility or packaging recycling. Different accreditations can cover different areas.

04. WHITE WINE

FROM VINE TO GLASS

Languedoc, France



The writing was on the wall in Languedoc-Roussillon from the beginning of 2024, with a dry winter and early spring making drought a real possibility. Despite the absence of spring frost, growers remained nervous and irrigation water was already being applied in early May. Finally, in the second half of May there was heavy rain. However, the rainfall was not uniform. The flowering went surprisingly well and many vines set a large crop. The presence or absence of soil moisture became obvious during the long hot days of summer. Those vineyards that benefitted from the May downpours, and/or irrigation, were able to flourish. Those that did not struggled, with leaf loss, fruit desiccation and in a few drastic cases, vine death. The harvest got underway in August with the earlier ripening white grapes and some of the black grapes destined for rosé and sparkling wine production. At the end of the month the temperature sky rocketed, peaking at over 40°C. It is a testament

to the robustness of the traditional black varieties of Languedoc-Roussillon that they survived this late season roasting and were picked in good condition. The challenging weather means that there will be variability in quality although both Les Grands Chais and Sieur d'Arques (Aimery) seem happy with what they have in their cellars. As predicted, the drought did hit the crop size. Overall production was down 15% on 2023 and 10% against the five year average.

In the heart of the Languedoc region, in Occitania, is Domaine de Petit Roubié, a certified Organic Agriculture (Ecoverte) domaine which has been farmed organically since 1985. Across the estate's 80 hectares of vineyard, the aim is to encourage a resurgence of the region's natural fauna and flora - bees, butterflies and wildflowers are allowed to flourish alongside the vines. The wine itself is a delicious example of Picpoul de Pinet and was an immediate hit with the team when we first tried it. Youthful floral and fruit aromas and a dry, refreshingly acid palate with flavours of white peach, citrus and salt hints, make this the perfect accompaniment to prawns, scallops and pretty much all types of white fish.

Our Recommendation



Gavi, Terre del Barolo

Pale greenish straw with a slight spritz. Clean, fresh and youthful at first, followed by plenty of pure green fruit. Delicate and relatively light bodied. A dry white wine with decent acidity and moderate alcohol.



A wet winter got plenty of moisture into the soil and it remained a little cool and damp during the spring and summer. Cyclone Gabrielle hit the North Island in February, bringing gale force winds and torrential rain. Low lying vineyards with poor draining soils saw extensive flooding. However, by the time the storm reached the South Island it had lost most of its energy and moisture. This meant that the all important Sauvignon Blanc crop in Marlborough got through pretty much unscathed. What is more, the arrival of autumn ushered in fine dry weather for the harvest. At 501,000 tonnes the total New Zealand crop was the second largest on record. Overall quality should be good. Ren Sauvignon Blanc is a zesty white with ripe tropical notes and a smooth palate. This is a classic Marlborough Sauvignon Blanc which is consistently produced in a fuller, riper, softer style that develops well. This wine is clean, fresh and tropical, with fruit from several vineyards situated throughout Marlborough.

05. RED WINE

PRESSED TO PERFECTION

Italy

“ Fans of the Giro d'Italia road cycling race witnessed the defining feature of the 2024 growing season play out before their eyes: day after day of heavy rain in May as the riders toiled across the south and centre of Italy.



This persistent high humidity was ideal for the rapid spread of downy mildew. How regions and individual vineyards coped with this disease determined the size of crop they harvested.

Roughly speaking, the centre and south of Italy struggled: Abruzzo and Sicilia saw their potential crops halved, whilst Puglia and Toscana lost about a third of their harvests. In the north the mildew threat was better managed and losses were a lot smaller.

The Veneto, crucial for the production of Prosecco and Pinot Grigio, saw yields down by only around 10%. There were some fearsome temperatures in the summer, but these hot, dry periods were interrupted by cool, damp interludes. Given what had happened before, it is a relief to report that the harvest passed off without any major incidents. Despite the early start to the growing season, the picking began a few days later than in 2023. Many producers are surprisingly upbeat about the quality of their grapes. Whilst the weather compromised yields, what was left came through in reasonably good shape. However, there will be heterogeneity, particularly in DOC areas such as Montepulciano d'Abruzzo.

After a couple of downward revisions the national crop is estimated to be 37-39 million hectolitres. Assuming that this number is about right, it would represent a reduction in production of around 25% against 2023 and the five year average. Vitti Primitivo is an impressively intense and complex full-bodied red. Deep garnet in colour with liquorice, tar and dark fruit on the nose. Full-bodied with a decent tannic grip and low acidity and a spicy finish.

Stellar Running Duck Shiraz

Stellar Winery is a unique South African organic wine producer which constantly pushes the boundaries of wine production whilst keeping social responsibility and respect for the environment at the heart of everything it does. Stellar is the world's top producer of no added sulphur wines, one of the purest expressions of organic winemaking. All wines are also vegan friendly.

HAVE A GRAPE DAY

Pocket Watch Shiraz, Central Ranges, Australia - We have followed the resurgent Oatley wine operation for several years; it draws not just on the resources and experience of the family but also on industry veterans such as Chris Hancock and Larry Cherubino. This team has developed a pair of premium Australian house wines for Crown Cellars, a Chardonnay and a Shiraz under the Pocket Watch label. The Shiraz is deepish pink purple in appearance and has a good intensity of black cherry and blackberry fruit with just a touch of oak. These notes carry through to the mid to full-bodied palate. This toothsome red wine would be a good choice to accompany grilled meats. The Oatley family have long had an understanding of and commitment to the vineyards of New South Wales (going back to the days when they owned Rosemount Estate). In the case of the Pocket Watch range the fruit is sourced from the Central Ranges, a region west of Sydney on the slopes of the Great Dividing Range. Stylistically the winemaking team seem to be aiming for the modern style of Australian red: less jammy and less heavily oaked than in the past, with a bit more freshness on the palate.

Medievo Crianza Rioja

Medievo source the grapes for this wine from vineyard plots in the "Las Planas" at around 500 metres above sea level. It is composed of the classic Rioja varieties: Tempranillo, Garnacha, Graciano and Mazuelo. Fermentation takes place in temperature controlled stainless steel vats at 28°C. The young wine is then matured: the first year spent in oak barrels (70% American; 30% French) followed by a year in bottle. The result is an elegant modern take on the classic Crianza style. Mid-deep ruby-garnet in colour, there is plenty of raspberry and loganberry fruit up front, followed by hints of oak and leather. The palate is mid-full bodied with yielding but grainy tannins and a long finish. Roast lamb and roast beef, Jamón ibérico and Manchego would all be perfect partners.

06. ROSÉ WINE

TIME TO WINE DOWN

Spain

'In most of Spain a mild dry winter was followed by a warm and very dry spring. There were no significant frost losses and the flowering went well. As in the rest of Europe there were a few storms in the early summer, but the fungal disease pressure was much lower than elsewhere. However, August was shockingly hot, with successive periods where the thermometer was stuck over 40°C. This desiccating heat had a profound effect on the size of the 2024 crop, reducing it significantly from what had been projected earlier in the year.

The first white grapes were picked in the middle of August with the key Tempranillo harvest at Bodegas Medievo in Rioja starting on 5th September. The odd downpour in September brought welcome relief from the drought and reinvigorated the ripening process. Everything was picked by the end of September. From a quality perspective most producers are happy with their wines. The big issue is quantity. The most recent national estimate has the crop at 33 million hectolitres, down 18% on 2023 and down 23% against the five year average!

'Lobo Loco Tempranillo Rosé - Tempranillo is the main grape used to make red Rioja where it is blended primarily with Garnacha (though Mazuelo and Graciano are also allowed) to make Spain's most famous wine. Deep red in colour with strawberry fruit character on the nose. Ripe and juicy on the palate with soft tannins and a hint of spice. Great for quaffing and enjoying with garlic mushrooms, spicy meatballs and strong cheese.

Viticultori Ponte also celebrates a new accreditation from SQNPI, which is all about sustainability. Ponte Pinot Grigio Rose is a great example of the Pinot Grigio grape and the care used to create this beautiful wine, it's a fresh and youthful off-dry wine that has a lovely rose petal pink colour.





07. CHAMPAGNE / SPARKLING WINE

BRING ON THE BUBBLY

Celebrating its 75th Anniversary, Viticoltori Ponte also celebrates a new accreditation from SQNPI which is all about sustainability.


The SQNPI (Integrated Production National Quality System) was conceived by the Italian Ministry of Agriculture and Forestry that takes in to account all facets of production from vineyard to winery, minimising the use of synthetic chemicals in the vineyards and rationalising practices such as fertilisation and establishment of specific technical standards. The distinctive 'Bee' logo can be found on the label of accredited wines with this sustainability system guaranteeing quality of the final product with these significantly higher standards.

Ponte embarked on this accreditation back in 2021 with a select group of our growers, with vineyard area of over 300 hectares.

The secret was the introduction of 15% of black grapes, Pinot Noir, expertly blended with the remaining percentage of Glera to create the perfect alchemy.

This was the inception of Prosecco Rosé, a totally new variety with surprising organoleptic characteristics. It was immediately clear that this was a product that would be hugely successful worldwide, but its launch with this appellation had to wait several years.

In the mean time many producers voiced an interest in the formula, piling pressure on the request for formal approval of production.

The time finally came on 15 October 2020, with the product's Italian debut, followed a month later by the start of global distribution.
